- 6. For compliance and widest dissemination.

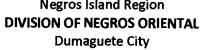

0	Facilitate the assessment of school electrical system to make necessary repairs and /or upgrades to prevent fire accident.

0	Install appropriate and available fire suppression equipment or resources such as fire extinguishers water source, and other indigenous materials.

0	Identify evacuation areas and classrooms that can be used as temporary shelters during disasters and emergencies.					
0	Prune trees to avoid entanglement from electrical wirings and avoid potential harm to life and property.

the school.	
o Ensure that students, teachers, and	
personnel have identification cards with

O Secure vital school records and store in	
safe locations.	
o Coordinate with barangay officials on	
pedestrian safety of students.	
o Document accidents experienced by	
students and personnel within the school	
to improve prevention and mitigation	
measures.
