## 2017 BRIGADA ESKWELA SEARCH FOR BEST IMPLEMEMNTING SCHOOLS

- 1. In line with the implementation of the National Schools Maintenance Week dubbed as Brigada Eskwela on May 15-20, 2017, the Division of Negros Oriental will hold the 2017 Search for Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing School.
- 2. The search not only aims to showcase CLEANLINESS, BEAUTIFICATION AND GREENNESS but also the EXEMPLARY CAPABILITY to be COMPLIANT to the standards set by other programs/projects like WINS, DRRM, ECO-FRIENDLY SCHOOLS, CHILD-FRIENDLY SCHOOLS etc.
- 3. Anchored on DepEd Order 43 s. 2017, the categories of the Search for Brigada Eskwela-Best Implementing School are as follows:

Elementary Level

Category	Number of Teachers (National)	Resource Generated
Small School	9 and below	90,000 and below
Medium School	10 - 29	100,000 - 300,000
Large School	30-50	300,000 - 500,000
Mega School	51 and above	500,000 and above

Secondary Level

Medium School	10 - 25	100,000 - 300,000
Large School	26-100	300,000 - 1,000,000
Mega School	101 and above	1,000,000 and above

- 4. In connection with this, this office reiterates that all schools both in the Public Elementary and Secondary are directed to join the competition which will start from the District level, Congressional Level and up to the Divisional Level.
- 5. Selection Committee at the District level shall be composed of the following:
  - a) Public School District Supervisor/ District In-Charge—Chairperson
  - b) District Brigada Eskwela-Adopt-A-School Coordinator -- Member
  - c) District DRRM Coordinator---Member
  - d) District Physical Facilities In-Charge--Member
  - e) District Federated PTA President -- Member
  - f) District Nurse--Member
- 6. Selection at the District Level must come up with TOP 5 per sub-category both in the elementary and secondary having a total of 40 schools to be screened at the Congressional level.

- 7. Monitoring and Selection at the Congressional Level will be composed of all the PSDSs/DICs chaired by the Congressional District Cluster Head. This panel shall come up with TOP 3 from each sub-category both in elementary and secondary levels thereby having a total of 24 schools per Congressional District which will be competing with the finalists of the other Congressional Districts and submit official entries for the Divisional Level on May 29, 2017.
- 8. Finalists from the Congressional Districts must see to it that their documents be completely arranged and orderly featuring pictures with captions before, during and after each prioritized activity during Brigada Eskwela as reflected in BE Form 1, attendance sheets with diverse participation be properly filed and the whole documents in "ALBUM" should appear as a COMPLETE PACKAGE of the school represented observing the criteria stipulated in DepEd Order 43 s. 2017. Every activity must be backed up with means of verification to merit points. PREPARING THE ALBUM IS LIKENED TO SELLING OUT YOUR SCHOOL to attract more partners and stakeholders and establish more partnership building activities for the benefit of the entire school all for one purpose which is geared towards levelling up of the quality of basic education system.
- 9. The criteria for the Search of Brigada Eskwela-Best Implementing School are as follows:
  - a) SCOPE OF WORK-35%
  - b) DIVERSE VOLUNTEER PARTICPATION—25%
  - c) GENERATED RESOURCES—15%
  - d) ALIGNMENT TO BRIGADA ESKWELA THEME-5%
  - e) CREATIVITY & INNOVATION-10%
  - f) INCREMENT OF RESOURCES & VOLUNTEERS—10%
- 10. Enclosed are the SCORE SHEETS ready for use observing the same criteria aforementioned.
- 11. The JUDGES of the Divisional Level Search will be composed of the following:
  - a) Mrs. Jenith Corpis Cabajon, Division Coordinator, Social Mobilization & Networking
  - b) Mrs. Esterlina B. Paragoso—Division Program Education Supervisor
  - c) Dr. Carmelita A. Alcala—Division Program Education Supervisor
  - d) Dr. Juliet J. Tuala—Division Program Education Supervisor
  - e) Mr. Joseph R. Gemina—Project Development Officer
  - f) Mrs. Emma S. Mate-Senior Education Program Specialist
  - g) Dr. Jeazon Mark P. Consing—Medical Officer III
- 12. In the Division Level, eight (8) school winners will be chosen from each sub-category both in two (2) levels namely: elementary and secondary of which these 8 schools will be the official entries for the 2017 Regional Level Search for Brigada Eskwela-Best Implementing School.
- 13. Schools and selection committees have to follow a **<u>TIMELINE</u>** for judging and submission of entries which is also enclosed in this directive.
- 14. Services rendered on a saturday/ sunday entitles one to receive a One-Day Service Credit for teachers and Compensatory Overtime Credit (COC) for non-teaching personnel.
- 15. This MEMORANDUM also serves as TRAVEL ORDER.
- 16. Travelling and other incidental expenses shall be charged to local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

#### I. SCOPE OF WORK (35%)

Scope of work is based on the school BE plan and physical facilities repair and maintenance needs assessment such as repair works, maintenance works, compliance to WINS standards, compliance to DRRM standards, compliance to Eco-Friendly Schools standards, compliance to Child Friendly Schools standards, new improvements and beautification/landscaping/learners kiosk installation. The computation is based on the percentage of work completed multiplied by 35%

- 4 if all items within the school underwent repair/repainting/replacement work by volunteers / and were able to meet standards of WINS/DRRM/ECO-FRIENDLY SCHOOL/CHILD FRIENDLY SCHOOL
- 3 if only up to 75%
- 2 if only up to 50%
- 1 if only up to 25%
- 0 No work was done at all
