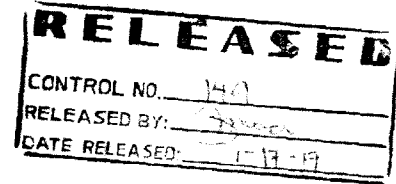

GUGMA KO, HALAD SA MGA GIBAGYO

To: Schools Division Superintendents
Division Chiefs
Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads
All Others Concerned

1. In the light of the destruction brought by Typhoon Nina in the Bicol Region last December 2016, this Office has launched one of its banner projects, "Gugma Ko, Halad sa mga Gibagyo" last January 8, 2017 during the Negros Island Region Management Committee (ManCom) Meeting.
2. As members of one DepEd family, we feel a social responsibility towards the learners who have to recite classes in makeshift classrooms in Bicol, it being a region frequently ravaged by typhoons.
3. With the full cooperation of the schools division offices through the student and pupil organizations and the Federated PTAs, the project aims to kindle the value of caring, sharing, and a heart to be a brother's keeper. The project further aims to:
 - a. Develop learners' deeper awareness on the state of fellow learners terribly affected by typhoons;
 - b. Encourage learner's active participation in carrying out community responsibilities;
 - c. Empower the youth in engaging in projects for the benefit of other learners; and
 - d. Gather sufficient monetary donations to help renovate and rehabilitate classrooms(s) of identified school destroyed by the typhoon.
4. The project will be carried out by all Supreme Pupil Government (SPG) and Supreme Student Government (SSG) organizations in cooperation with the School Federated PTA.
5. The SPG/SSG and the School Federated PTA shall design creative ways of implementing the project in gathering **voluntary monetary donations** from learners and other members of the community. No teacher and/or school head is allowed to gather/collect donations.
6. Donations will be gathered from January to March 2017. SPG/SSG together with the Federated PTA shall make a monthly report of the

donations gathered and submit both the report and the donations to the division office.

7. The Schools Division Superintendent shall assign a focal person for the project who shall take charge of gathering the donations from schools and accomplishing a consolidated report.
8. The focal person shall submit all monthly collections and reports to the Regional Office through the Education Support Services Division. The Regional Office shall upload an update of donations received through a memorandum and through the regional website.
9. By March 2017, the Regional Office shall identify a school through the recommendation from the recipient region.
10. All schools are enjoined to support the project and work together to build schools, responsible learners, and strong communities.
11. Widest dissemination and implementation is desired.
