Rabies is a zoonotic and human infection caused by Lyssa virus, usually occurring following a transdermal bite or scratch by an infected animal. Rabies remains to be a public health problem especially among children with a highest case of animal bites. It is the most acutely fatal infectious disease responsible for the deaths of 200-300 Filipinos every year.

The Provincial Health Office in coordination with the Department of Health and Provincial ~~Veterinary~~ Office will be conducting an orientation/training on rabies among school nurses, teachers and the likes on **September 14 and 15 (2 batches), 8:00 a.m. at Plaza Maria Luisa**. The objective of this orientation/training is to have effective and efficient management on rabies exposure toward eventual reduction and ultimately elimination of human rabies.
