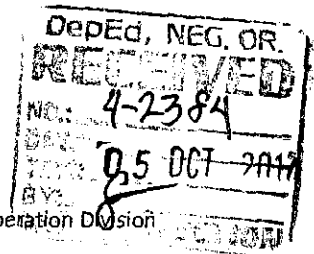

September 29-30, 2017 | Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall, Siaton, Negros Oriental

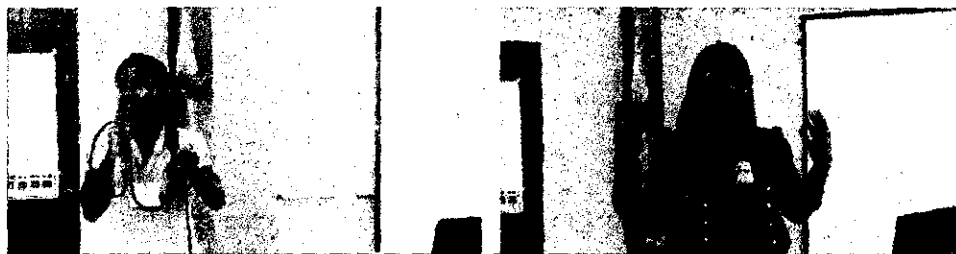
